I once more want to talk about the motions for the instructed vote that every parish council should be acting upon by their March meeting. Councils are to conduct the vote at any upcoming face to face council meeting to which due notice has been given. The council records the voting results and sends a copy to National office, and a copy to Donna Provost, Diocesan Administrative Assistant. The Parish President or her designate must then bring the third copy to the Diocesan Annual Meeting on May 14th where the vote will be recorded.

They are most helpful in making an informed decision about the Per Capita Fee Increase motion. We are in a tight spot when considering this increase. Our membership, and thus the income, is dropping and without the fee increase the CWL will face insolvency within a few years. With this fee increase we may lose members, but we can work at building back up the membership, and continue the work of the CWL. If you subscribe to the Catholic Register, you will have received the insert celebrating the CWL's 100th Anniversary. The history and the accomplishments of the CWL since its inception, is an amazing story of faith in action. The CWL continues today to live our gospel values, and be an important voice for social justice. I encourage you to support this motion.

We are finishing the third year of the theme Care for Our Common Home. By divine providence, and the pandemic, it became a three-year theme, which underscores its importance.
