Letters have been sent, inviting eligible members to let their names stand for election to council executive. Let us pray for a full executive. We work as a team and it is rewarding and exhilarating. If you received the invitation to let your name stand for diocesan council, please consider saying yes. Diocesan meetings are a great opportunity for newer league members to see the work of the league beyond the parish level. It is a one-day event, it is affordable and fun. I'm hoping that we can fill the hall with members from across the diocese.

We are blessed this year to have the Ontario Provincial Council Convention in Ottawa, July 11-13. Please check out the details at cwl.on.ca. Consider attending for 1 day, 2 days or the full event. There will be several members, from diocesan council and some parish councils, attending. Let us know if you are attending, so we can connect. You will not be alone. My first provincial convention was in 2008 in Arnprior, hosted by Pembroke Diocesan CWL. I was so impressed with the speakers, the prayer services and the workshops.
