At the Fall 2016 Meeting I presented the following motion. The reasons for this motion are explained here. In order for this motion to be passed an instructed vote is necessary. You will find in this Newsletter, the explanation, the form for this vote and the directions that must be followed for the instructed vote.

Membership Fees paid to National are comprised of the current national fee (\$13.00), provincial (determined by each provincial council) \$3.00 in Ontario and diocesan (determined by each diocese) \$1.50 in Pembroke Diocese. These fees are called per capita fees.

In addition to the amounts paid directly to National, we in Pembroke Diocese, also pay a levy or \$1 per member and Diocesan Fees of \$45 per parish council. A motion to collect these fees, in lieu of raising the amount of per capita fees paid to National was adopted in 1995. The amount has not changed in 21 years. To my knowledge no other Diocese has this Levy and Diocesan Fee method of collecting fees.

The problem with our method of collecting fees is that it is not very efficient or equitable. Also the levy and diocesan fees are to be paid to the diocese by the end of March or the Spring Meeting. Very few councils pay these fees on time.

Councils in other dioceses pay a much larger amount in per capita fees to National. In Ontario, some dioceses collect as much as \$6. (In 2014, 4 dioceses paid \$3 per member, 5 dioceses paid \$4 per member, 2 dioceses paid \$5 per member and 1 diocese paid \$6 per member.) We pay the lowest at \$1.50

The \$1.50 which you pay directly to National is returned to the Pembroke Diocesan Council at the end of the month in which membership fees are submitted.

Because our method of fee collection is so cumbersome and in-efficient, and because we are currently updating the Manual of Policy & Procedure for our Diocese, we think that it is an appropriate time to change our fee collection method.

Increasing diocesan per capita fees to \$3.50 per member would mean each council would pay directly to National \$19.50. Below is the breakdown of these fees:

National	\$13.00
Provincial	3.00
Diocesan	<u>3.50</u>
Total	\$19.50

If we change from the current system to the one proposed in my motion all will pay the same amount per member. This will mean a slight increase for some of the larger councils but a decrease for the smaller councils.

As I write this report, we are preparing for the 2017 World Day of Prayer”. This year's program was written by the women of the Philippines, where “women are discriminated against and treated as subordinates in the home, in church and in society” (from World Day of Prayer Service pamphlet). There is so much to do! But here are a few things to give us hope:

- Viola Desmond will be the first Canadian woman on the Canadian \$10 bill. (learn more about Viola Desmond)
- “Our Lady of Guadalupe Circle” is a coalition that has been formed to strengthen and foster relations with the Indigenous People of Canada. (go to www.cccb.ca to learn more)
- Development and Peace Share Lent Campaign theme is “Women at the Heart of Change”. Women are responsible for 60-80% of food production in developing countries. Directing funds to their projects will help increase food production.
- Pope Francis dedicated February 8th (feast day of St. Josephine Bakhita) for prayer against Human Trafficking. There is a grassroots movement to designate St. Josephine Bakhita as the patron saint of kidnapped and trafficked persons. (learn more about the life of St Josephine Bakhita).
- At the 2017 CWL Provincial Convention in Thunder Bay, delegates will participate in a “ceremonial walk” to remember murdered and missing indigenous women. (find out what is happening with the Canadian Government inquiry into MMIW. Ask questions. Push for action.)

Learn more about issues that affect the dignity and rights of persons and issues pertaining to social and economic justice and create awareness in your community. Through kindness and gentleness, let us make this world a **Just** place for all.

Marriage and Family: According to an article in the Catholic Register, January 29, 2017, Michael McDonald is the new director of COLF. He wants to make COLF the “Go for All Issues” concerning Life and Family. In order to get the message out, he intends to use social media such as: Facebook, Twitter and other internet means.

COLF has many resources on subjects relating to Life and Family (bioethics, theology of the body and reflections on family life). Michael says: “If we want to shape culture, we have to reach out to all people involved in the issues of Life and Family”.

Sanctity of Life: According to the Catholic register January 29, 2017, Campaign Life Coalition officials reported that gender – identity is making inroads not only on Parliament Hill but also at the United Nations. A bill was passed in the House of Commons to add gender – identity expression to the protected against discrimination in the Canadian Human Rights Act and Criminal Code. This bill is now in the Senate for approval. Matthew Wojciechowski reports that gender – identity at the United Nations is a new focus to destroy the natural family. The United Nations is forcing all countries to do away with natural marriage laws and replace with same sex marriage. Matthew says that Pope Francis uses the strongest language against gender – identity theory, calling it “satanic” and “demonic”. Michael also says that the United Nations would like to declare universal abortion rights but pro -lifers are preventing this from happening.

Today, March 25th is the feast of the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We celebrate the angel Gabriel's appearance to the Virgin Mary (Luke 1:26-38), his announcement that the Blessed Virgin had been chosen to be the mother of Our Lord, and Mary's *fiat*—her willing acceptance of God's holy plan.

The Angelus is an ancient prayer celebrating the Angel Gabriel's annunciation of the Lord to the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is recited at 6 A.M., noon, and 6 P.M., and the time for recitation was traditionally marked by the ringing of church bells (which were known as the Angelus bells). During the Easter season, from Easter through the Saturday before Pentecost Sunday, the prayer Regina Coeli Laetare is recited in place of the Angelus.

Thank you to the nineteen councils who responded to the new annual report survey. It was a challenge to us all as we are creatures of habit and resist change.

In 2016 there were no resolutions submitted by any councils in our diocese. Of the resolutions listed on cwl.ca the five that were considered the most important by those councils who studied them were as follows:

2016.04 Amend the Canada Health Act to Identify Palliative Care as an Insured Health Service

2016.05 Amend the Canada Health Act to Include Home Care as an Insured Health Service

2016.03 Warning Labels on Food and Drug Products for all Inactive Substances and Additives

2016.01 Equal Access to Permanent Resident Status, an Amendment to the Immigration and refugee Protection Act

2016.02 Eating Well with Canada’s Food Guide

One important action that we can do with little effort is to go online to www.cwl.ca to sign the petition relating to resolution 2016.05 Amend the Canada Health Act to Include Home Care as an Insured Health Service. Letters and emails are also important actions we can do to let our politicians know our concerns.

In looking at websites of other Dioceses I was interested to read Resolutions Chair, Mary Bannon of London Diocese reminding her councils of some past successes of resolutions passed by National. Did you know the CWL is responsible for the banning of the use of tanning beds for those under the age of 18? Also the CWL is responsible for Canada Post designing and circulating religious themed stamps.

It all starts with a member who has a concern about a particular issue. It can be something that has happened to her, in her family, parish, community or country. It is only our passion which leads to action that will change the world.

“When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.” Acts 2.1-4

I began with that scripture because of our new national theme; "Inspired by the Spirit, women respond to God's call." We are in for an exciting two years as we follow the Holy Spirit wherever he leads.

When completing the Annual Report for Spiritual Development I noted that good things are happening in our parish councils. Great new programs available from Formed.Org, Matthew Kelly and Fr M Gaitley were helping our members to grow spiritually. There were Year of Mercy pilgrimages and activities that renewed and refreshed us in the ministries that we all love to do. The reports showed that we can grow in the study of Catholic Teachings and on the Role of Women in the Church. Let's make that a council challenge. Invite your priest or some other knowledgeable person to speak to these issues. Please check with your priest or the diocesan council for recommended speakers.

I was surprised to see that a lot of councils reported little or no financial support for missions. This is historically a strong area for CWL councils. I'm hoping that the rather bleak amount of support may have been a result of some confusion with the new online reporting. It also doesn't take into account the non-financial support like knitted items, food bank donations etc. Let's challenge ourselves to double our amount for next year.

Book of Life: We are still having problems with the reporting of our deceased members. It has gotten better but there is room for improvement. I would like to share with you about the process:

1. The Spiritual Development Chair sends an email or letter to both the diocesan chair for Spiritual Development who is local Keeper of the Book of Life and to the National Keeper of the Book of Life.
2. You must include the name, date of decease and parish council name along with the membership number of the deceased.
3. Spiritual Development chair or designate should take a moment to make sure your own deceased members are in the book correctly at the Spring and Fall meetings as well as the Convention.

Please check out the latest edition of The Canadian League magazine for information about the Twelve Hours of Prayer for Palliative Care on May 4th. Let's really get behind this important initiative this year.

All in all, keep up the great work for God and Canada.
